? What call do you make?

Bruce Keidan: I bid **5H**, cue-bidding partner's singleton or void.

Gail Carns: **5D** I hope either 6D or 6C makes (If partner bids 5S I will bid 6)

Asim Ulke: I bid **5D**. If partner bids 5S then I bid 6S or play 6 of a minor. Assuming that partner has no more than one heart loser we should have a slam somewhere.

Jane Marshall **5H** Partner was not under pressure. I would bid 5 hearts.

Trudy Cohn: **DBL** I am going to double. The only thing that I'm sure of is that they are not making four hearts. Any other bid by me is a crap shoot.

Reanette Frobouck: **DBL** I think double is right. This shows a big hand and no clear action. Whatever partner decides to do you will be happy with. Certainly not bidding a 4 card diamond suit.

Ernie Retetagos: **Double.** Shows a good hand. Partner can see the vulnerability, and will probably pull with a singleton or void in hearts.

Herb Sachs: **double** should say short spades and a good hand. I will lead a trump three times for what its worth. partner may remove. i don;t know what I will do after four spades. we may have a slam in either minor. sometimes pre-empts do their job and they get you!!

Bill Holt: **DBL.** I'm not certain who can make what, but I am fairly certain they are going for a bundle in 4HX. I have an ill fit for partner's Spades, so lean towards defending. Partner's initial pass makes slam less likely – in fact his failure to open 2S makes 4S seem unlikely. I will double and perhaps partner will know what to do. If he bids a minor, I will raise.

Steve Nolan: **5D.** Best bid for getting us to the right slam. Hope we've got one

Stan Ruskin **4NT** I must be missing something here but this seems easy to me. Partner has a lot of spades and somecards (8-10 points I'm guessing) and one or no hearts. Thus, he must have 6 or 7 minor suit cards. If I bid 4S, I'm just guessing that he has at least 6 good spades. Even if he does, they don't rate to break evenly. Therefore, a minor suit game looks like the best bet – but which one. I bid 4NT which can't be for play and implies no spade support and obviously a diamond suit – having more clubs than diamonds. Thus, partner can pick the minor suit game. With equal length, clubs or with 4 diamonds and shorter clubs, diamonds. There might even be a slam but we can't get there.

Mary Paulone Carns: **5H.** I want to be in slam if we're not off 2 heart tricks. Sounds as if partner has at most 1 heart, but we have to consider that hearts could be 6322. Don't see any reasonable way to get to 6D, if that is the right spot

Warren Oberfield: Dbl I didn't see mention of if this isimps or match-points, so I will presume it isimps. In the absence of a partnership agreement for pass to be forcing, I would double 4H.

Jim Bachelder: 4nt I made this same bid at the Toledo Regional a few weeks ago. I opened 2C (precision) holding A, Q, KQJXX, KTXXXX and after 2S, P, 4S, I bid 4NT. Partner "fielded" the bid and properly bid 5D holding: XXX, AKXX, TXXXX, X. BINGO!

PJ Prabhu: Double. Having opened in third seat, pass would not be forcing. 4NT should be RKCB with Spades as trump. Partner knows that I don't have many hearts. Not having found a fit, I double to show a good hand. If partner bids a minor, I'll raise to 6.

Florine Walters: Double—I have no heart stopper . If I bid 5 diamonds, partner would think I had spade support. I know they can't make 4H.. If 4NT meant to pick a minor I will bid that, but I take that as blackwood and spade support.

Auxilliary Expert

Marvin Rulin double this is a tough one for me. our opponents have taken up our bidding space while we have the better cards by far. we have game and possibly slam somewhere but in what suit. partner has at least 5 but likely 6 spades and is short in hearts. i'm tempted to bid 4 spades but opponents could tap him down by playing hearts. i'll take the easy way out and double for a sure profit, maybe even 800. if partner has extra length in spades he can correct or bid

In a Sectional team game , South opened 1 NT and declared 3 NT after a transfer sequence. At each table, a heart was led to the 10 , and East's Jack held the trick. East had to find a return at trick two. At one table, East returned a small Club. Declarer won the Jack, knocked out the spades, and eventually made an overtrick with the aid of a diamond finesse.

At the other table, East switched to the Q of Clubs at trick two. Declarer won and led a spade to the Q, which held, and continued a spade, won by East. Careful defense thereafter held declarer to 8 tricks. The Q of clubs play was the Merrimac Coup, the sacrifice of a high card to kill an entry in an opponent's hand.
