SOUTH WEST NORTH EAST 1S PASS 1NT PASS ?

What do you bid?

Bill Holt 4S. We might have a Heart fit but Culbertson said to play 'Swans' (7-4's) in their long suit. I can take the Club taps there and it should have a play

PJ Prabhu 4S. Couldn't choose between 3S and 4S. How is partner to know that Qx, Qx, xxxx, xxxxx is better than -, xxx, xxxxx, AKQxx? With the first, we are favored to make 4S. Being vulnerable at IMPs, I take the push.

Warren Oberfield: I bid 3S, planning to bid 4H if partner bids 3N over 3S. Clearly, this is a bit different than what partner would anticipate for 3S, but this seems like the most flexible approach with an awkward hand. Gazzilli anyone?

Lou Joseph: 4S Hmmm. Is 1NT forcing? Do I care? I'm going to bid 3H because partner cannot pass a jump shift (without getting a new partner). If partner bids 3NT or 4H, I'm going to bid 4S which should show a whopper with 6-4 or better (7 -4 here) with slam interest, but allows partner out, if his 1NT is predicated on a rotten 6 HCP such as the J of diamonds and the KQ of clubs, which will render my club void useless. If he has anything extra he should move over 4S.

Steve Nolan: .4S. At least this removes all worries about missing a game, and partner will realize that the choice of trump suit has been made. If partner bids again, any bid in a new suit will be a cue bid in support of spades

Stan Ruskin: 4S .I think you want to find a contract that may not be the perfect contract but might work anyway. You're vulnerable, its imps so games are the premium here. Maybe it is 4H (even 6H), maybe 5D – it could even be 3NT, and maybe there is no good game contract. I bid 4S. Partner has something and I might make this opposite a void – losing 2S and either 1H or 1D. It may have no play. I don't think anyone can double. I might make it if partner has a doubleton spade and either the ace of hearts or KD and he could have more. he could have long clubs and nothing else and I'll go down. That's life but I think 4S is the best chance.

Herb Sachs: 4S If I bid two hearts and partner is one-three bad he passes-not good; i bid 4 spades and pay off if partner tables no spades and lots of good hearts; at least i should have a plus!

Richard Katz 3H ordinarily what comes to mind is bidding 4 spades. however on this hand after much thought I bid three hearts, forcing. Such that if

pard is short in spades, long in hearts we

get to the correct game or slam.

Jane Marshall: 4S I would jump to 4 spades. We may miss the heart fit, but I will jump to game in the 7-card spade suit. I usually count losers and this is a 5-loser hand.

Ernie Retetagos 3 Spades. Too strong for a minimum rebid, not strong enough to jump shift.

Asim Ulke I bid 3S. If partner replies with 3NT then I bid 4H.

Marvin Rulin 3 Sp Asim once asked me rhetorically, do you know what they call a 7 card suit?....."trump" If partner bids anything I can then show my hearts Florine Walters: 3H, which is a bit of a stretch, but we are vul and playing IMP's. If partner bids 3NT, I will have a bit of a problem, as I will know they do not have two spades, and at most three hearts. It would be quite easy to bid three spades, but you could miss game if partner has four or more hearts and a minimum hand.

Bob Zimmermann: 4S There's enough playing strength here to make up for the lack of high cards. I don't need much more than xx Jxxx xxx xxxx to have a shot at making this.

Auxilliary Experts:

Eric Ruben: 3H. Slam has play opposite as little as x Qxxxx xxx xxx so it's hard to imagine taking a weak stance with these cards. Of course, you can also run into the club bust and make nothing. Where is an ACOL 2S when you need it? If pard denies heart interest I'll gamble it out in four spades

Jane Marshall knows what's on top of every bridge players' wish list:


That would be to play a session of bridge and then be able to ask one of the resident Pittsburgh experts where and why you went wrong.



BRIDGE IN THE BURGH.....by ernie retetagos A successful throw-in play



The fourth best diamond was led to the Jack as East followed with the ten. Declarer then took three successful finesses, heart to the Jack, diamond to the Queen, and club to the Queen. The Ace of hearts brought the ten from West. Next came three rounds of spades ending in dummy as West discarded a diamond on the third spade.



When the Ace of diamonds played. East was forced to pitch a club. A club was then led to the Ace, and East had to yield the last two tricks after being thrown in with the spade.
