Note: 1NT is semiforcing; 2NT strong raise; 3N-semipreemptive raise.

PJ Prabhu. 2NT. Fixed by the system. At least it was not explained as 4-card major opening. Hence I get my raise and game force described in one bid. Second choice: 2H.

Trudy Cohn: 1NT I bid a forcing 1NT and then bid 4 Spades over anything at the 2 level except 2 Hearts. That will get a 4 Heart bid.

Lou Joseph: 2C Feh. Why is 1NT semi forcing by an unpassed hand? Although why am I even asking because why would I bid 1NT forcing - how would my partner every know I have an opener plus if I start with that bid? I suppose I'll have to bid 2C a la Jimmy Klein to force the auction and inhibit a club lead, intending to show spade support on my next bid.

Asim Ulke: I bid 2H. I like to start with 1NT with these kind of hands if it is forcing. I refuse to bid false suits just to force to game, like 2C or 2D. My best suit is hearts so I show it

Gail Carns . 2D best minor game forcing

Steve Nolan: 1NT. The final contract is very likely to be 4S, and 1 NT, 2NT, 3NT, 2H and 4S will all get you there. 1NT will locate a 4-4 heart fit, caters to a possible slam if partner responds with a jump and doesn't distort my hand's shape, so I choose that bid. Note: Partner can't pass my 1NT after a first seat opening unless it was a psyche; if it was a psyche, 1NT is as good a spot as any

Jane Marshall. I bid 3D (a Modified Bergen 3-card limit raise or better for spades). If my partner has a 6-loser hand or better with 4 hearts, he knows that we will bid game AND he bids 3 hearts (looking for a 4-4 heart fit). I will raise 3 hearts to 4 hearts. If he just rebids 3 spades (showing no interest in game opposite a 3-card limit raise), I will bid 4 hearts (showing my 4-card heart suit, allowing him to pass 4 hearts if he also has a 4-card heart suit). I plan on bidding game even though I have an 8-loser hand...because I have 2 1/2 quick tricks, a hand which I would have opened, and 14 HCP.

Herb Sachs: 2D This hand screams NT but partners hand may not. I start with 2d expecting to play in 4s or 3nt (or higher) with partner declaring

Bill Holt .2H. I owe partner a heart but can always preference back to Spades if he raises H. Alternate choice would be 2NT but I would rather owe partner a side suit card than a trump. Easier if 1NT was Forcing, obviously.

Mary Carns: 2D (game force), planning to raise spades at my next opportunity. Normally I would bid 2C with this distribution but the quality of my minor suits is too unequal.

Ernie Retetagos: 2D. This hand will wind up in 4H, 4S, or maybe 3N. 2D is the lie that keeps all options open and shows some side values if partner has extras and wants to explore slam.

Marvin Rulin: 2D We belong in spades, notrump or hearts but getting there is frustrating because of the convention responses outlined here. The hand would be perfect for a 3NT response under most situations, describing four, triple three distribution with three spades and 13-15 pts. If we were playing 1NT forcing, two of a minor would allow partner to further describe his hand. We should have four spades for a 2NT bid, and five hearts for a two heart bid. Therefore we have to make a temporizing bid, two of a minor which is forcing by a non passed hand. I would try two diamonds since it better describes my hand in case partner is interested in notrump and still leaves room to find a four/four heart fit. If partner raises diamonds I'll jump to four spades.

Bernie Fudor: 2C I think I bid 2 c which is the best of a lot of bad calls

Stan Ruskin: I bid 2H because I can't figure out what else to bid that will be guaranteed game forcing. I bid 3S over anything else partner bids and go from there. If I bid 2NT, I'm lying about my spades and it could create a problem later on in the auction. If I bid 3S if partner bids 3H over 2H, partner will accept spades unless he has 4H and in that case will bid 4H over 4S and I can go from there if I want to. If partner fragments over 2H, that is good also because then I know he has 4H.

INTERNET POST (cont.)

Warren Oberfield: 2D Presuming I am playing 2/1, I bid 2D. It is likely that partner will declare, and 2D is the "whitest lie". It is difficult to see how being short one diamond causes a problem. If partner rebids 2H, I will raise. If partner rebids anything else (including raising diamonds), I will show the spade fit. This may "wrong side" the contract for a diamond lead, but also may "right side" the contract for a club lead.

Auxiliary Experts

Eric Ruben : 2D. This hand will wind up in 4H, 4S, or maybe 3N. 2D is the lie that keeps all options open and shows some side values if partner has extras and wants to explore slam.

Paul Rosenberg: 4S I would bid 4 spades. The real issue here is that my hand is clearly game forcing opposite my partner's hand. The question is what happens if N has a powerhouse. My bid may be considered preemptive and N may be unwilling to explore further. Almost any other bid is a lie, and the concern is that it will cause N to incorrectly evaluate the south hand. 2nt lacks the 4th spade 2 hts lacks the 5th heart a jump in minor might be considered, but N would consider this a source of tricks In all of these cases, N may seek slam and the contract goes down I am not familiar with semiforcing 1 nt...but I play this as a relatively weak response.

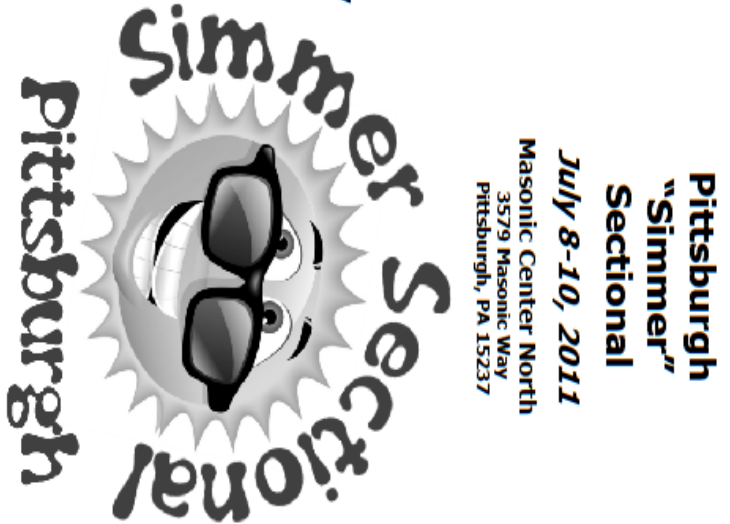
