Two hearts is a limit or stronger club raise; Jump raises preemptive

Ernie Retetagos 2 Hearts. This shows limit raise values with club support, which is what I have.

Stan Ruskin : 2D I can't think of anything more than 2D which is forcing for one round. What partner bids will determine my next bid.

For example, if he bids 2S, 3D or 3C, I will bid 3H asking for a H stopper to bid 3NT. If he bids 2NT, I will try 3NT. If West bids, I will see what happens.

Trudy Cohn: I will bid **2 Diamonds**, the least bad of the options available. Second choice would be 2 Hearts showing a limit raise or better in clubs but I hesitate to do this with less than 4 clubs

Lou Joseph: 2D I'm going to start with 2D. If partne can bid NT or make a Western Q bid, I'll consider game. If not, we'll probably end up in 3C or 3D, depending on the auction. If partner has a very good or very distributional hand with clubs and spades, 6C is not out of the question.

Steve Nolan: Pass. There's something wrong with every bid now, but I can bid informatively over partner's reopener. It's not that likely to go pass-pass-pass, but if it does at least the opponents are getting a bad trump break

Herb Sachs: 2H considering the restraints i vote for the lie with "maybe" the least downside! two hearts pretending i have a spade in with my clubs; if i pass i'll never recover; if I bid two diamonds (game forcing)I probably wont recover; what remains??

Richard Finberg: 2H. Hoping to steer NT to partner's side. The risk of partner rebidding clubs with only 3 is small.

Gail Carns: 2C Since a jump is preempt I bid 2C

PJ Prabhu: Pass. 2HWith four H in my hand, pd is likely to be short and hence I can expect a reopening double. I will then respond 2H showing some unusual strength that I could not show previously. If pd then bids 2S, I can return to 3C. I don't know how else to bid this hand. I certainly rule out double, 1NT, and 2H.

Marvin Rulin: Pass I have eleven high card points but no suitable bid. Notrump is risky without a spade stopper or bona fide heart stopper. Partner is unlikely to have four diamonds. I'll pass now and come in later depending on how the bidding unfolds.

Bob Zimmermann: 2D I can't see any call other than 2D here.

Jane Marshall: 2D. I should have 5 diamonds, but the alternative is to pass and hope to be able to show 11 hcp the next time I have a bid. If partner rebids 2 spades, I will bid 3 clubs. If partner rebids 3 clubs, I will raise to 4 clubs. I don't have a game forcing hand, but I don't think that I should pass.

Asim Ulke: I double. It caters to most responses from partner. By the way double does not promise 4 spades. It implies a hand that cannot bid a suit, which may be the lack of 5 spades or lack of points and/or length in an unbid suit which also includes a fit with partner. South's holding of 11 point lowers the danger of partner getting the bidding too high before South finishes the description of his/her hand. Over 1S by partner, a bid of 1NT is a reasonable option. Other bids by partner make it easier to proceed with the South hand.

Bernie Fudor: 2H The classic impossible hand i put a heart with my clubs and bid 2h

Bill Holt : 2D. Tough problem. I think the 'least lie' is 2d. Shows good values, doesn't place all eggs with 2 (or 3) clubs. How do I tell partner his J-10-tight of Hearts is a stopper?
