Asim Ulke: Pass This is a tough one. Can I take a pass? I think I would pass at the table also. It is a gamble that opponents do not have 8 tricks.

Herb Sachs: 3H I bid three hearts as this is the only known seven card fit we have; I know i may have to take taps in the long hand but maybe I can throw losers!!!

Mary Carns: 3C. The least lie. This problem would be easier if south had opened 1c with this hand, which is what I would have done.

Gail Carns: 3C If I have to bid a suit I don't have it is the cheapest possible.

Steve Nolan: 3C. Every possible answer seems to be wrong. At least 3C doesn't mislead partner about my spades and hearts, and I will be able to rebid sensibly if partner doesn't pass.

PJ Prabu .3D. I like the other choices even less.

Paul Caplan: .3H it is partners known suit and he knows i am under pressure so i might only have 3 hearts

Lou Joseph: Option A Pass) Option B 2NT (Lebensohl) Well, assuming 2S is weak, I'm going to convert and sit. Yes, I know that EW is vulnerable, so South rates to have a good suit, but, as I say, he could have overcalled 1S red with a decent hand, so let's take our chances. Partner should have a decent hand to force me to the 3 level. I just hope that our table is near the door so I can fly outside if we write up -670 (or worse). Option B) Perhaps a good hand to invoke a reverse Lebensohl bid. If my partner bid 2NT in this auction. I would think that he was most likely 3-3-4-3 minimum WITHOUT a spade stopper, for if he had one he would be more likely to convert to penalty. He obviously does not have 4 hearts and may be wary of a 4-3 fit in this auction expecting a bad break. If he had four clubs he woud bid them, so he is suggesting 4-3 in the minors, and there for 3 spades to nothing. If my partner thinks this way, I would bid 2NT. I would bid this if I were playing with Arlene, because she would work it out, although I would get yelled at anyways.

Option A if I'm playing with a more forgiving, less experienced partner

Option B if I'm playing with more experienced, less forgiving partner

Robert Zimmermann: 3D. Nothing is good here. 2NT wrong-sides the contract (if NT is correct at all), and I'm loathe to bid a 3 card suit in response to p's negative double - especially lacking a ruffing value.

Jane Marshall PASS. Since partner did not bid at the 3 level (which he would do with 12 hcp and at least a 5-card suit), I do not believe that we have a game anywhere. Partner should have 10 hcp to make a negative double which requires me to bid at the 3 level. I will hope to set 2 spades 1 or 2 tricks.

Stan Ruskin 3C While, I might argue with opening this hand – 8 losers, 4/3/3/3 etc. – I know that everyone in The world will open this at match points. That being said, all I can do is bid 3D. I can't even see an alternative. This denies 4H and any S stoppers. The only forcing bid after I bid 3D is 3S. All other bids are not forcing. Remember, partner has made a negative double which can indicate some minimum – 7-10 point hand – so if he has a game going hand, he will cue bid. Florine Walters 2NT A perfect hand

Florine Walters 2NT A perfect hand for the scrambling 2NT asking partner to choose the contract, flat hand and does not promise a stopper in spades. If I did not have that agreement with partner I would bid 3 clubs.

Bill Holt Pass. I will play for +200 instead of playing a 4-3 fit at the 3 level. I we play 3H we'll take the ruffs in the long trump hand - not good. If partner leads a diamond I will fire back a trump. Good thing it's matchpoints so I won't have to explain -670 to my teammates in case it makes.

Marvin Rulin: 3 Hearts. This is really tough. Any bid I can make will stretch the truth but 3 hearts will at least give us a Moysian 4-3 fit and can't be hurt too badly. No trump is tempting with this distribution but the lack of a spade stopper could be disastrous

Trudy Cohn: 3D I'm not happy with my choices but I will bid three Diamonds. That is better than bidding 3 Hearts and taking the spade ruff in the long heart hand.
