Ernie Retetegos: .5 Diamonds. Partner has shown an unbalanced non minimum hand. They are strong enough for me to correct to 4 diamonds if I don't have 4 spades. With three prime cards, I have to bid game.

It is instructive to look at the imp odds for bidding close vulnerable games. If the contract is 4 diamonds at the other table, we will pick up 10 imps when game makes. We will lose 6 imps when we go down one

.Jim Bachelder: 3NT! What else? I can make three notrump opposite an 11 count such as AQXX, XX, KQXXX, XX and partners three spade bid opposite my negative double, which could be less than I hold, should show more than a minimum. I'm not worried about hearts, no one has bid them.

Florine Walters: 3NT From the bidding, partner probably has at least six diamonds and four spades. All partner needs is Axxx in spades and KQxxxin diamonds and we would be cold for 3NT, which is what I am bidding.

Jane Marshall 4D. We may be too high, but I don't want partner to play a 4-3 fit. Surely he has at least 4 diamonds...he probably has 5 diamonds based on the opponents' bidding. He may have both 4-card majors and, if he does, he will correct to 4 hearts.

Robert Zimmermann: 3NT.

Hamman's Law applies. Besides, I need as little as AQxx xxx KQxxx x to take 9 tricks. Red in first seat, that's not unreasonable.

Bill Holt : 4S, but I don't like it. 3NT will wrong-side the contract if partner has Qx(x). At least we can take the club taps in the hand with short trumps. My diamond fit, prime honors, and the 'Don't miss a game when Red at IMPS' doctrine leads me to bid it. Partner's 3S bid, vulnerable, should suggest a little extra - which he'll need. I hope he is 4=2=5=2 on this hand.

PJ Prabhu 5D. This is more aggressive than the value of my hand; but there is a fair chance of game. AQJx, xx, KQxxx, xx in partner's hand would be sufficient for game, whereas AJTx, Kx, KQxx, xxx yields a probability of much less than 50%. If match points or non-vulnerable, I'd bid only 4D.

Marvin Rulin: 3 NT, I'm tempted to bid 4 D but hate to go past 3NT. partner's bid is not a reverse but rather a response to my negative double. i have a balanced hand with a club stopper. we might be able to cash nine tricks before opponents get their club tricks. If partner's hand is unbalanced he can rebid diamonds or spades, in which case i will explore slam possibilities since we would have a great double fit.

Herb Sachs: 3NT Vulnerable at imps not the devil made me do it; I bid 3NT; I will find out quickly who is lying! Hope it's not me.

Steve Nolan .3NT. It's IMPs, we're vulnerable and partner made a free bid. 3NT is our likeliest game, and it's now or never.

Stan Ruskin: 3NT Very interesting. I agree with the double of 2C even though I don't have Four spades. Do we have a game and, if so, is it 3NT, 4S or 5D? If partner has AQS and KQD, it is probably 3NT. Maybe the 4/3 spade fit works. For 5D to work, we need to hold the major suit losers to one since we probably have a club loser. For me, it comes down to passing 3S or bidding 3NT. I think I would try 3NT since I am vulnerable. If partner has a very unbalanced hand, he could bid again. He knows that we have only one club stopper so we have to be able to take 9 quick tricks including the AC.

Richard Katz: I bid 4 diamonds. Should show a good hand with 3 spades as 3 spades by partner was not forcing. At match points, bidding 4 spades is certainly reasonable Paul Caplan 3 NT 9 tricks might be easier than 102

Arlene Port: 4S I either wanted to bid 4 diamonds or 4 spades and spades won out because if there are clubs to be trumped, the hand with 3 spades can do this without penalty. My third bid was: I don't have a clue!!

Opposite a hand like AQxx-Ax-KOxxx-xx 3NT or 5D or 4S will all make but that haand is an absolute maximum for partner to hold. Opposite hand like AJxx-Axx-KJxxx-x 4S has the best chance and 1down will not be a disaster.

So I bid 4S.

Lou Joseph: 4S I'm not particularly crazy about this problem, because I'm sure no matter what I do, partner will not like it. However, I'm going to bid 4S on the theory that: Partner must have a good hand or he would have passed; he does not have club strength which would probably have induced a double; since I do not guarantee both have either 4-3 or a tolerance for his opening minor) he is probably short in hearts - if he had both majors and a good hand he would bid 4C. Most of my partners are old enough to play 4-3

- fits, so good luck to them.

play by an uph, the auction 1D-2C bid the cheaper major. He/she probably (overcall)-2D shows 4+D, at least invitational values, and specifically one four card major. This is exactly what I have. partner so this bid was not available to me, at my first turn I would bid whatever is a limit raise of D, rather than negative double. The negative double suggests S & H and creates a wild guess for South at their second turn. Any of 3N, 4D, or 4S could work. If I had to guess one of these, I would guess 3N, hoping partner considers this cooperative with the inference that my club holding is limited by my failure to bid some number of NT at my first turn holding only 3S with 2 club stoppers. But I wouldn't have that problem.

Fred Schenker: I'm bidding 4D. Pd's free bid over 3C should be promising something extra, but I don't think I'm going to be able to run 9 off the top in 3N. I don't play that Ax is a stopper in majors with my double (although I will this auction. I don't think I can pass, as I have extras as well. 4D should deny 4S, so I think the likely contracts are 4S or 5D or 4D. Pd could be 6-5 in D and S. and we could be cold for 6D.
