## ASK ERNIE

### You ask!! Ernie has the answer!!

Question: Playing at a club game, you are in first seat at matchpoints with everyone vulnerable, and you hold A Q 10 x x x, x x, x x, A x x. What is your call?

Answer: This hand is on the border of 1 spade and 2 spades. Neither bid could be criticized, and several players opened 1 spade. If the suit was a minor, I'd open with one of my suit. One of the criteria for opening a borderline hand is whether or not you have a descriptive rebid.

I think this hand looks more like a 2 spade bid. It meets my definition of a 2 bid, in that it is a good 6 card suit with one card on the side, and 6-11 HCP. I'd be more tempted to open a one bid if I was not vulnerable. A nonvulnerable preempt can be made on a pretty weak hand. A vulnerable 2 bid is a preemptive bid, but not a weak bid. It should always show a good suit. Since you are not planning on sacrificing when vulnerable, a 1st or 2nd seat preempt bid should be constructive.

**Bob Zimmerman: 6 spades.** the problem here is distribution. East has a two suitor with all the clubs and probably QJ of hearts. West has some spade length, hope fully only four. North was not forced to bid the second time so he must have five or six spades and some values, KQ or KJ. He should be able to cash five or six spades, a club ruff two hearts and at least three diamonds. If north has only 5 spades the going gets tougher but he is finesseable at least once. I also thought of bidding 5 clubs but would bid 6 spades no matter what partner responded.

**Ernie Retetagos: 6 Spades.** It's likely that East has a singleton or void in spades. In spite of the expected bad break, I don't see how I can not bid slam. If West has long spades headed by an honor and the 9, there will be some handling charges, but there should be still be a play for slam.

What do you bid?

**Gail Carns 6S** Partner freely bid 3S. If they have as little as K 6th of spades they should have a good play for 6.

**Trudy Cohn:** I will bid 4 spades. There aren't enough points in the deck for my partner to have anything but long spades so I will settle for a sure plus score rather than think that a slam is possible with right hand opponent being long in hearts with me.

**PJ Prabhu: 4S.** With only three spades and expected bad breaks, I'm not confident of making a slam (in spades). For his free rebid of 3S, I'm placing partner with a 5-card suit. 4H is a close second choice. But that would torture partner.

**Steve Nolan: 5NT.** Grand slam force in spades. If partner has the king and queen of trumps -- and he must have something for that 3S bid -- the odds are that the grand slam succeeds.

**Jane Marshall 5C.** I think East's heart bid was a void (lead director). But, since East will be on lead against a spade contract, I will bid 5C (exclusion). Since North bid spades freely, I believe he has 6 spades. If he has the Kxxxxx, I am willing to have him play 6 spades.

**Bernie Fudor: 5S** I think everything is breaking badly.

**Asim Ulke: 5S** It sounds like east has about 11 cards in hearts and clubs, most probably 5 hearts, and most of the missing points. Partner's free bid of 3S leaves him with a 6 card suit headed by KJ, KQ or QJ and nothing else. West will be holding about 4 spades and 1 or unlikely 2 hearts. 6 spades will fail if partner has QJXXXX, X, XXX, XXX but will make with KQXXXX or probably with KJXXXX. I think bidding 5S would ask for trump quality but I shall bid 5C to prevent any confusion.

**Marvin Rulin 6 spades.** the problem here is distribution. East has a two suitor with all the clubs and probably QJ of hearts. West has some spade length, hope fully only four. North was not forced to bid the second time so he must have five or six spades and some values, KQ or KJ. He should be able to cash five or six spades, a club ruff two hearts and at least three diamonds. If north has only 5 spades the going gets tougher but he is fineseable at least once. I also thought of bidding 5 clubs but would bid 6 spades no matter what partner responded.

**Stanley Ruskin: 6C** This is interesting because it depends on what conventions you are playing although I think my bid should be pretty obvious. I bid 6C. This is obviously exclusion KC Blackwood. If partner has 0/3, he will bid 6D. If he has the KS, he will bid 6H. In either case, I would correct to 6S. If partner has the KQS 6<sup>th</sup> or KQJS 5<sup>th</sup>, he should bid 7S since he know that I have the A and at least 3 card support. If the opponents are clever and bid 7C, we play DEPO. Thus, we would double with 0 and pass with one. Again, with the KQ 6<sup>th</sup> or KQJ 5<sup>th</sup>, he should bid 7S.

**Herb Sachs 6S** I am playing my partner for QJxxx or six spades; just cannot to bring myself to bid 5NT on the offchance partner holds KQ of spades; I hope we can make six.

**Bill Holt : 6S.** 5c XKCB (exclusion Key Card Blackwood) would be scientific; except the õgood newsö answer (5H showing 1 Key Card) gets us too high to ask about the Queen. I expect partner to have a weakish hand with a good spade suit. I would guess 6S to be cold unless West has two Spade tricks, and since I cannot find out what I need to know, I will just bid it and find out if it makes later.

**Barbara Bergman: 6S** - I blasted into 6H last month so there is a pattern developing here. I'm not a savvy bidder. Seriously, I see no reason to cue bid 5 clubs. What's partner going to cue bid?? Not sure 5S would get me the answer for which I'm looking. It all hinges on how good and long partner's spades are. I would expect extra length due to the free 3S bid. A bad spade break is probable. Oh well, I have very understanding teammates!!

**Lou Joseph: 5S** Hmmm What's wrong with this picture? East has opened and reversed. North chose to bid 1S only over the double, showing 0-8 pts, give or take. Now he is rebidding 3S after I have made a penalty double. West takes an immediate preference to 3C and North now bids 3S, neither doubling 3C nor waiting for me to double 3C. Well, what could North have? I think he has a long suit and a bad hand.

I do have a magnificent hand. My true concern is that this hand is now playing from the wrong side. Call me a pessimist, but given the strength of my hand, East must have a very strong club suit. So I won't be surprised to see an opening heart lead ruffed by West. North can't have anything to cue bid, so the question is if the spade length is in the West hand, can North pick up the suit for 12 tricks? I need partner to have the KQ of spades to make this, so I'm going to jump to 5S hoping that partner will bid 6S with a good spade holding. Looks like 5 or 7 to me!!
