BRIDGE BYTES

SIMPLE SQUEEZE

A declarer can sometimes make an extra trick when a defender or defenders have to guard more than one suit. An advanced squeeze requires some expertise, but a simple squeeze can be executed by the average club player. Sometimes the most difficult part of a simple squeeze is recognizing that the possibility exists. Clyde Love in his classic book, "Bridge Squeezes Complete", coined the term BLUE as a memory aid for identifying the essential ingredients for a squeeze.

B means that one defender is busy guarding more than one suit. L is that declarer has only one loser remaining. U is that at least one threat is in the upper hand, (sitting over the squeeze victim). And E means that there is an entry to the threat card. To rectify the count, declarer should lose enough tricks early in the hand to reduce to all winners except for one. If a defender may have to guard two suits, just cash all the winners in the other suits to squeeze them. At a club game, none of the declarers managed to take more than their 11 top tricks in 3 NT.

After East opened 2 spades, South ended up in 3 NT with the Q of spades lead. Declarer should duck, and win the spade continuation. If East has the remaining spades, they can be squeezed if they have both heart honors. Just unblock diamonds and cross to hand in clubs to cash the diamond, pitching a heart, and then run clubs. In the 2 card end position, East can not hold the last spade and both heart honors. The key plays were ducking trick one, and cashing the top diamonds before running clubs. If West has a heart honor, there is no squeeze, but it can't hurt to try.

DIRECTING DIRECTORS POST

(The following is a letter sent to me by Dan Plato of the ACBL when I requested information regarding behavioral, as well as directorial responsibilities of the director.)

Laws 80, 81, and 82 point out the many, many responsibilities that fall upon the tournament director's shoulders (and the same applies to a club director). The list is quite daunting, so much of it falls into a category of "must do's," from keeping the game running, to scoring, to administering laws and regulations. It takes education, experience and some highly-developed skills to accomplish all this.

Nonetheless we are keenly aware that one of the most common issues we face, as shared with us in feedback from players, is the perceptions of directors being aloof, abrupt, non-caring, unavailable, or even condescending. Over a year ago we began an intensive project to integrate customer service skills as priority number one. This is an on-going educational project where we are both training and holding our employees accountable for being much better customer service representatives. there are new expectations and we have seen improvement on many fronts. We emphasize Listening, Empathizing, and Valuing our Players as important foundational skills. We are striving to make this a part of our culture, to have our employees so ingrained with these values that it becomes second nature to apply them as we deliver rulings, sell entries, solve disputes, etc. We want every interaction our customers to be a positive one, even when we have to apply a law that might turn a top into a bottom!

I thank you for your interest in this area. One of the greatest challenges we meet is addressing the specific complaint versus the general perception. It is through addressing the specific that we hopefully can change the general perception you shared.

PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE PBA

IMPORTANT INFORMATION—PLEASE READ

The PBA recognizes that the number of club directors is at a critical low. To encourage players to become directors, and to encourage currently inactive directors to become active, the following incentives will be put in place:

Any member of Unit 142 who is not currently (as of March 1, 2015), and has never been, a club director will be eligible to receive a stipend of \$250 upon completion of the following:

- Preparing for the Club Directors Exam by enrolling in a Club Directors Course, taking the Ruling the Game online course, or studying on one's own
- Taking and passing the Club Directors Exam
- Directing, without supervision, at least 6 club games at clubs within Unit 142

Any club director who is inactive (as of March 1, 2015 has not directed any club games for at least 1 year) will be eligible to receive a stipend of \$200 upon completion of the following:

- Updating one's skills by taking a Club Directors Course or other courses available online via the ACBL website, directing under supervision, or studying on one's own
- Directing, without supervision, at least 12 club games within Unit 142

The director who plans to qualify for a stipend should keep a diary of games directed. In order to receive these incentives, the director must be a current member of Unit 142 in good standing, with ACBL dues or ACBL Life Member fees paid up.

Stan Ruskin : DBL This is difficult. Where are the Hearts???? I think there are three legitimate bids and I'm

Sure there are good arguments for all three. You have a three loser hand that could be more based on the auction or less. One option is to double and convert the expected 4H bid by partner to 5C which would show about what this hand is – at least 6 Clubs and 4 Diamonds. The other option is to bid 4C which is admittedly the most conservative choice. The third option is to bid 5C which is very aggressive and eliminates the 5D possibility. I think I would Double 3S at the table. Partner can convert if he wants to. If he bids 4C, I would pass; if he bids 4D, I would raise to 5D and if he bid 4H, I would convert to 5C as I noted above.

Asim Ulke: I bid 4D

Jane Marshall: 5C...BUT I WOULD HAVE OPENED 2C!! A 3-loser hand is too good to open 1 anything. When I am within 1 trick of game, I open 2C.

Bernie Futor: 3 NT I wont violate Hammans Rule (if 3nt is possible you must bid it) Seriously good problem what does 4 sp show what does 4nt mean?

PJ Prabhu 5C. What I believe we have a good chance to make. It's true that with as little as xxx, xxx, Qxxxxx, xx in partner's hand we can make 6D. But if I bid 4D, will he raise me to 6? If I bid 4D and partner has xxx, xxxx, Qxxx, xx will he raise me to game when we might make a slam? Hence, I keep it simple with this bid. Certainly, no 4NT bid since it will not help us reach the right contract.

Richard Katz I say double. If partner passes, were there. If partner bids four hearts, I bid five clubs and diamonds have been introduced! If he bids four clubs, I bid four diamonds. If he bids five clubs or diamonds, I bid six. Doubling three spades must be a big hand to force to four level. This is slightly bigger, while keeping many options in play. If six diamonds is correct, I was one short to bid four diamonds over three spades, need an imaginative partner here. Even 4-4-3-2 zero needs only a 2-2 break in clubs, 3-3 diamonds to make 5. But 3-4-4-2 more likely or better. Even 3-5-queen fourth-1 makes five.

Gail Carns 3NT who knows whats right

Trudy Cohn I will bid 4 Diamonds forcing partner for one round. If he bids 5 diamonds, I will bid 6. Any other bid and I will bid 5 Clubs. I will bid 4 Diamonds forcing partner for one round. If he bids 5 diamonds, I will bid 6. Any other bid and I will bid 5 Clubs.

Lou Joseph: 4D Assuming we play negative doubles through 3S, I'm bidding 4D. Vulnerability is wrong to defend, partner did not double for hearts. This hand is probably going to make a slam in a minor or a wonderful score for the opponents!

Bill Holt 4d. Partner did not Negative-X and East did not raise Spades. With a 3-loser hand for play in the minors I want to be in a minor game. If partner now belatedly bids 4H I can bid 5c.

Steve Nolan: 4D. I need so little from partner to make a slam that I'm not going to stop below the six level. If a slam in diamonds is our spot, 4D is the best bid to find it. This shows a very powerful hand with at least four diamonds and longer clubs, and partner must bid. With a good hand, partner can take the initiative by bidding Blackwood or leave the initiative with me by cue bidding hearts. With a bad hand, partner will take a preference to 5C or 5D, over either of which I will bid 6C

Bob Zimmermann: 4NT, keycard for clubs, then 5H after 5D, confirming all of the keycards, and asking about the CQ. I'm not stopping short of 6C, but if P has some extras (AKQx of hearts for example) I'll lay the groundwork for his raise to 7.

Marvin Rulin: 5 clubs. There aren't many bids available except some number of clubs. This hand could make anything from three to seven clubs. I'll take the middle ground and bid 5.

Paul Caplan: 4d. if partner bids 5 diamonds I will bid 6. over 4 hearts I will bid 5 clubs. Paul

Herb Sachs: 4S; if partner bids five hearts six clubs is next; if partner bids 4NT I can only bid five clubs, however I will bid six diamonds over five diamonds. They got me

Ernie Retetagos: 5 Clubs. I am bidding what I think I can make. Bidding 6 is a speculative gamble that requires help in two suits. Any other call will muddy the water, and could lead to a disaster if partner is weak.

Arlene Port: 5C. That's my story and I'm sticking to it. Also, I couldn't think of anything else.
