RESPONDING TO STRONG 2-CLUB OPENINGS

There are numerous systematic methods that can be used to respond to partner's two club opening. Some systems respond two hearts to show a second negative. Several systems use step responses to show HCPs or controls.

When showing HCP's, a two diamond response shows 0-3, two hearts shows 4-6, etc. When using step responses to show controls, a King is 1, and an Ace is worth 2. A two diamond response shows 0-1 control, two hearts shows 2, two spades shows an Ace and a King, two NT shows 3 Kings, etc. Either system could be the best one to use, depending on opener's hand.

In standard methods, a two diamond response is negative or waiting. A response in a suit shows responding points, and at least a 5 card suit. The suit must be headed by either one or two of the top three honors, depending on partnership agreement. A two NT response shows 10-12 balanced. However many would bid two diamonds (waiting), instead of two NT. This allows opener to declare NT or a major suit after Stayman.

After a two diamond response, if opener rebids two of a suit, responder should have a second negative available. The cheapest minor is a popular second negative. A second negative denies an Ace or King. Another common second negative situation occurs when the opponents overcall the two club opener. Some play that double by responder shows a second negative, and has nothing to do with the overcalled suit. Opener knows that partner has a bust and can place the contract. A pass by responder shows values.

Whenever responder does not give a second negative, a game force is established. If opener rebids a major suit after opening two clubs, responder should raise to three with trump support and a control, and jump to four without a control. Games and slams are easier to bid if a game force is established at a low level. Regular partnerships should discuss the positive response requirements, and the means to show a second negative.

Trudy Cohn Pass Since I am not sure that I can set 2S, I will pass. If they go higher, I will double for penalty

Jane Marshall: Pass. I am hoping that the opponents get into trouble. However, they may have a great crossruff fit.

Gail Carns : pass if partner reopens with a double I will pass

Ernie Retetagos: 2 NT. Lots of bidding going on. Partner has something resembling 6-4 shape, give or take a card. Most likely they will retreat to 3 clubs, unless they have extras. I can't let the opponents play at the two level with an 8-9 card fit. If I pass, partner may not be able to bid again with only a good club suit and not much else.

Arlene Port : .Dbl. My partner is not a passed hand and I have an opening bid. I think I will be more successful if I defend rather than bid. I will lead a spade and if they end up in two hearts, I will lead party favors. If they make it, I will let my partner go back to compare and I will go to the bathroom. This is a tough decision at IMP's

Paul Caplan : pass you have a nice hand with nowhere to go. If partner reopens with a double I will pass I have no suit to bid.

Robert Zimmermann. 3C I have better fits for the opponents than I do for partner, but I expect partner to have 10 minor suit cards - likely 1246 shape. So, let's push them up a level as we fight for the part score at IMPs

Pj Prabhu: **Pass.** I don't see an alternative (am I "mentally" blind?). I have no support for partner's suit, no suit of my own, and extreme length in RHO's suit. I'm not about to trot out 3H which, incidentally, should be a cue bid in support of partner's suit. In spite of my 12 points, I stay pat. Hopefully, partner can reopen with a 2NT bid asking for a minor.

Steve Nolan: 2NT. Not easy to find the right bid, despite knowing each hand's strength within a point or so, and a lot about the distribution. The opponents have about 18 points between them and have found their best fit. If I pass, it's hard for partner to bid again, so the opponents will have bought the contract cheaply when it ought to be our hand. A penalty double might be right, but I'm going to try for our only real chance of a game, 3NT. I will do that by bidding 2NT. I have a stopper in the three suits other than clubs, so it's quite descriptive. Partner can raise with a club suit that's likely to run, go back to clubs with a long broken suit or pass with a minimum.

Bill Holt : 2NT. I hate it, but I must bid something with this. At matchpoints I would like to double on my H position and club shortness, but would that be conventional? I won't do that at IMPS

Stan Ruskin I bid 2nt by default because it is the least bad of all other choices. If I pass, that will end the auction which I don't want to happen.

Fran Prus: I am going to bid 2 NT. My partner is likely going to bid 3C and I am out of the auction, unless the opponents bid again at the three level. Then I may find a red card.

Chris Wang: Pass am not sure about this hand. It seems like it is our hand, but it seems to be a misfit. It is possible the opponents can cross ruff this hand. Plus I am not sure what double would mean, probably a cooperative double, with tolerance for all suits (which I really don't have tolerance for clubs). Plus, we might not have a fit in a suit; if we have a contract the best one might be in no trump, but entries might be an issue. I am taking the low road and passing.

Richard Katz: Double, and hope it is beatable with heart lead. Minus 470 is possible, but unlikely. Two clubs is supposed to be an opening hand with a six card suit. That makes 13, 6, 13, and me with 12. That's a 44 point deck(as usual). If ex-partner has eight points, bidding against two bidding opponents, I'll be quite happy, as now I will only play the opposite direction! I will also thank partner for lead direction help, as now I may eventually know to lead my singleton.

Asim Ulke: I pass. The other option of doubling has more to lose than gain. And NT lacks source of tricks

Bernie Fudor: Pass Very good problem. No idea what to do so I pass. I have some empathy for raising on a
