UNUSUAL OVER UNUSUAL (We can all relate to that)

After your partner opens at the one level, a 2 NT overcall by your RHO is unusual, showing the two lowest unbid suits. By using a convention called unusual over unusual, you can describe your holding in the other two suits. Like most conventions, there are several variations regarding both the suits being shown and the HCP requirements. A variation that is easy to remember is that cue bidding the cheaper minor shows the cheaper major.

Your partner opens 1 of a major and they overcall 2 NT, showing clubs and diamonds. A 3 club bid by you shows hearts and a 3 diamond bid shows spades. If you are supporting your partner's suit, it shows at least a limit raise. If you are showing the unbid major, you are showing at least a 5 card suit, and an opening bid. By partnership agreement, you could play that the unbid suit only shows invitational values instead of an opening bid. If you do not cue bid, and bid either 3 hearts or 3 spades, that would be nonforcing and can be passed. 1S-2NT-3S =single spade raise less than limit, 1S-2NT-3D= limit raise or better in spades. 1S-2NT-3C=opening bid with at least a 5 card heart suit. 1S-2NT-3H denies spade support and is constructive, but nonforcing.

This same kind of structure can also be used after partner opens a minor and RHO bids Michael's, showing the majors. Cue bidding the cheaper major shows the cheaper minor. 1C-2C-3C=single raise, 1C-2C-2H=limit raise in clubs. 1C-2C-2D=diamonds with less than opening count. 1C-2C-2S=opening bid with diamonds. When the opponents interfere with a Michael's Cue bid or Unusual No Trump, a double is card showing. It shows the ability to double at least one of their suits for penalty.

~~This is a useful convention to use, because you do not have to replace a natural bid to use it. It's easy to remember because when you bid their suit, it reminds partner that you are playing a convention.~~

Ed Note: Not only should you read these great ideas, you should play them and see how great they are. Don't you want to be as good as you think you are?

Jane Marshall: 3N or 3S. If I am playing the system which I prefer, I would have rebid 2N (guaranteeing a 6-card spade suit). Then, after my partner bid 3C, obviously looking for a heart stopper, I could bid 3N to show my heart stopper. I would expect my partner to raise me to 4 spades with a doubleton spade. BUT, I have a great hand for a club contract. (4C could be the correct bid.) Tough rebid.

Richard Katz: I bid **three no trump**, protect AQ hearts. If we missed six clubs, oh well. Four clubs o k also, depending upon which way wind blowing.

Chris Wang I would bid **3 NT**. It probably is the only chance to reach 3NT. It is possible that this is not the right bid, and that either 4S or 5C is the right place to be.

Trudy Cohn: I bid **4 clubs**. We may have a game or slam in clubs. If not, then 4 spades should be okay.

Herb Sachs: **3NT:3H/3S and 3NT???** I will try 3NT; if partner has more to say -FINE

Bill Holt: **3NT**. Not perfect but it's positionally right for my H holding, my beefy S suit should establish easily, and at BAM 630 beats 620 or 600 in clubs. If partner makes a move past 3NT I will cooperate and head for 6 clubs or 6NT.

Bernie Fudor: **3NT** Good problem. finally decided to follow Bob Hammans rule and bid 3nt. As this the last chance to show my heart stoppers Either 3sp or 4 clubs might be right.

Steve Nolan: **4C**. The clearest way to let partner know my hand's shape. If I bid hearts or no trump we can end up in 3NT when 6C is cold. Since the system notes don't clearly address whether partner has shown a real club suit or just a club stopper, the definitive answer to that question will have to wait until the post mortem. However after a couple of cue bids at the four level, it should at least be possible to stop in 4NT if that's the best spot still available.

Stan Ruskin I bid **3NT**. I think it is the least of difficult bids. The only alternative, in my opinion is 3H which gives partner the chance to bid 3S with a doubleton S. However, if Partner has a singleton or void in S, we will miss 3NT since we don't want 3NT from his side. Bidding 3NT misses the possibility of a 6/2 S fit. If partner has a legitimate C suit, he can show it over 3NT. Partner's hand is unlimited so there could be more bidding after 3NT. This is a very difficult choice.

Gail Carns: **4C** 5 or 6 C will be about as good as 3NT

Asim Ulke: I bid **3NT**. There are four possible contracts to consider depending on the partner's next bid. 3NT: Partner is planning to pass. 4S: Partner is planning to make a slam try in spades. 6C: Partner will bid clubs again. 5C: At board-a-match scoring 5C is probably a losing proposition.

Robert Zimmerman 3NT Partner's 3 clubs may or may not be a suit. I have them stopped as well as two heart stoppers. If partner bids again, I'll show club support.

Ernie Retetagos 3 Spades. 3 spades is the obvious bid at any form of scoring. If you bid 3 NT, you win the heart lead, knock out the Ace of spades, and win the heart continuation. If the Jack of spades doesn't fall under the Queen, and it doesn't rate to, you're in trouble. If partner has AK of diamonds and A K 4th in clubs, you need an even club break to make 9 tricks. You could make 11 tricks in spades. If partner has A K Q of diamonds, and A J 4th of clubs, you need a club finesse to make 8 tricks. In a spade contract, you would be finessing for an overtrick. If you are in 4 spades, you will probably get a heart lead and make 10 or 11 tricks.

Craig Biddle: **3NT** Wow, this is ugly. We could have no game if partner has (a) S-x H-Kx D-AJxxxx C-A10xx and the cards are foul. We could have a good grand if partner has (b) S-A H-xxx D-Axxxx C-AKJx. 4S is the best game if partner has (c) S-J H-xxx D-Axxxx C-AKxx. 3NT is the best game if partner has (d) S-void H-Kxx D-KQJ10x C-AJxxx. And I can't bid 3H (or 3S) because partner will never know that I have a double H stopper until the hand is played. So I bid 3NT and hope that partner has multiple diamond stoppers and some heart length.
