BRIDGE BYTES

SUPPORT DOUBLE

The support double is a convention that allows the opener, after interference by the opponents, to show three card trump support for their partner's suit. Auctions such as 1D-P-1H-1S-X or 1C-P-1S-2D-X are examples of opener showing 3 card support. If opener raises to the 2 level, instead of doubling, that shows 4 card support. In the auction 1C-P-1S-X-XX, the support redouble shows 3 card support. The support double is played at the 1 or 2 level, since you don't want to force partner beyond the 2 level on possible a 4-3 fit. In all of these auctions, the opener's strength is undefined. Opener's hand is considered a minimum unless they make a further bid. When responder knows how many trumps partner has, that is valuable information for determining how high to compete.

Of course, every conventional bid takes away the natural meaning of that bid. When the intervening bid is 1 spade, it would be a very rare hand when opener would want to double for penalties. When the overcalled suit is at the 2 level, there would be a better chance of having a hand that is worth a penalty double. Players that don't like support doubles want the opportunity to penalize the opponents. Even among pairs who play support doubles, there could be a different agreement when the overcall is 1 No Trump.

I play support doubles with all of my partners, including when there is a 1 NT overcall. I wouldn't want to play a convention sometimes but not always. I think it would be a mistake waiting to happen. When a convention has some practical use, its value has to be compared to the loss of the natural meaning. Hands worth a low level penalty double are rare, and support double situations occur numerous times in every bridge session. It's a practical convention based on frequency and usefulness. There is also the negative inference when partner passes over the intervening bid, since they deny three trumps. Hands can easily be constructed where a penalty double would work out better than a support double. You can still get some penalty doubles by passing with strength in their suit, and hoping that partner can reopen with a double with more than a minimum response. Regardless of system, the most important thing is that you and your partner are on the same wavelength.

Richard Katz : Four hearts, perhaps overbid. Although there are special doubles for this type of competitive auction, they aren't science and why have partner guess. Delighted to have heard a strong passed hand raise.

Craig Biddle: 3S - the standard procedure when you want to go to game and the opponents have bid two suits is to bid the suit you have stopped. This should be unanimous. So our panel will all get an average for 4H-1 when partner has S-xxx H-AQxx D-Jx C-Kxxx and the SA is wrong. C'est la vie! :)

Asim Ulke .I double. It is not clear that I can make 4 heart but we should have 5 defensive tricks.

PJ Prabhu: 4H, but not with conviction. Despite my 16 HCPs, I see several concerns. Nonetheless, I'm electing to see the glass half full and bid the game.

Gail Carns 4C so partner will know I'm not preempting with 4H

Steve Nolan: Double. Educated guess at favorable vulnerability and with extras. I recognize the risk but West stretched and I don't think East knew how much.

Stan Ruskin 4H I must be missing something. There are 2 possible bids – 4H and X (penalty and hope to get 500). I think 4H is clear since I have no idea if we can even beat 3D. What if he had a 7 card suit? 4H should make almost all of the time unless there is some very strange distributions.

Someone is lying and I don't expect it to be my partner. We have at least 26 points between us and RHO opened and bid 3D and left hand opponent made a free bid of 1S. Someone has overbid by a lot but they can still possibly hold 3D to down 1 or maybe even make.

Jane Marshall: 3H...i do not double or pass. I do not think that my side has a game (partner passed originally).

Bill Holt: 4H. Not sure I can make it as I have lots of losers even with my nice count. I'm prepared to double 5d, though. And hey, it's one board at matchpoints.

Chris Wang: I bid 4H. I have an opening hand, but am only an overcaller.

Bob Zimmermann: Double East is a third seat opener at favorable vulnerability. I have 16 real and a partner with a limit raise. So, it's either double or 4 hearts. It looks like the same cards I need to beat this two (+500) in partner's hand are the ones I need to make game (+420). I'll pay off to AKJ-7 times of diamonds East and AJxx of spades in the West.

Paul Caplan: 4 hearts you have the values for game and you may not defeat 3d by 2 tricks and there is always the chance of a 5d bid you be glad to double.

Herb Sachs 3H As double might be ambiguous three hearts should state my case which is invitational; partner will bid three hearts if I pass/ back to square one.

Trudy Cohn: bid 4 hearts. Even devaluing the diamond queen, we should have a play for game

Arlene Port: 4H If I'm going to err, it's going to be on the side of the overbid. My partner is very encouraging and I like (not love) my hand. If it doesn't make I will certainly blame it on the dog who ate my homework. Seriously, I have bid much more on much less. It has a good chance and that's good enough for me. (So much for the scientific method.)

Ernie Retetagos: 3 Hearts. In a heart contract, if the opponents cash the first 3 tricks, you will have to negotiate 3 suits without loss to make game. I don't think it's worth it to push for thin games at matchpoints. Double will probably work out more often than not, but everyone at the table seems to have extra values. This suggests that there could be some distributional hands. I'll just bid a conservative three hearts.
