BRIDGE BYTES

CUE BIDS

When you and your partner are in a game forcing auction with an agreed upon trump suit, a cue bid usually shows a control in the opponent's suit. When you are not yet in a game force, a cue bid is a general show of strength. Partner's first obligation is to bid no trump with a stopper. A couple of cue bid situations came up in a club game as West dealt with neither vulnerable.

In some bidding systems, the West hand in #1 is an opening bid, either 1 of a minor or 1 NT. I think that most would pass and hear East make a takeout double over North's 2 spades. If you are playing the Lebensohl convention, West's bid of 3 diamonds, (or 3 clubs), is natural and shows invitational values. If West had a weak hand, they would start off with 2 NT. If East hears partner bid either suit at the 3 level, they are strong enough to cue bid 3 spades. This bid shows a strong hand with a fit. West bids 3 NT, and makes 5.

In hand #2, West opens 1 diamond and hears North overcall 1 heart. It now goes pass, pass, back to West, who reopens with a double. If East bids 3 clubs, West would probably try 3 NT. 3 clubs is reasonable because if East had another high card, they could have bid 2 clubs over 1 heart. If East only bids 2 clubs, West would cue bid 2 hearts as a general show of strength. East can't bid no trump, and they are too strong to rebid just 3 clubs. If East jumps to 4 clubs, West could possibly cue bid again on the way to 5 clubs. Since they are now in a game force, a 4 heart cue would show first round control. East, with nothing else to show, would sign off in 5 clubs, making 12 tricks because clubs break 2-2.

At a low level, a cue bid is a probe for a playable strain. It shows a good hand with a fit. Partner should rebid no trump, if possible. If unable, a repeat of their suit is the weakest action, and anything else shows some values. Once a game force has been established, a cue bid shows a 1st round control on the way to game in the agreed upon suit.

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Craig Biddle: I bid 4H here, showing a minimum GF with 4 hearts. I love my hand for hearts, but it's still possible for partner to have x KJxx AKOx OJxx - he has all his bids and we are off two cashing tricks. If partner has a more slammish hand he can move forward. My other bids here would be: 3S natural 3NT a minimum GF probably with 5S and 3C. 4C natural, 4D natural 4S natural slam try (4NT keycard ask with hearts agreed with the rest of you. (Ed note: Craig wrote a detailed description of a slam try method called "Mulberry Bush". It was fascinating, but I didn't have any room. If you are interested, either call me or Craig. We both have it on file.)

Ernie Retetagos: 5 Hearts. There are no footnotes, but I play that 2 hearts is artificial 4th suit game forcing, and 3 hearts shows a 4 card heart suit. Partner is 4441 or 544. I'd bid 5 hearts to let partner pass with a weak hand or bid 6 with controls.

Bernie Fudor 3S I'm torn between 3sp a slam try or 4h since I'm an overbidder I guess I bid 3 sp My pd could have a good 0454 which might have a good play for slam.

INTERNET POST

You are South, IMP's; none vul. And you hold: A 10 8 7 4 2 Η A Q 10 9 6 D J 5 \mathbf{C} The bidding is: SOUTH WEST NORTH **EAST** 1D **PASS PASS** 2C 1S PASS 2H PASS 3H **PASS** What call do you make.?

Richard Katz 4H Any problem here? I bid four hearts, hope to make it, and never look back

PJ Prabhu: 3S. Partner should have 4 Hs for raising my second suit. Slam is quite possible. Hence, I cue bid my SA. If partner bids 4C, I will continue with 4D. I don't see any close alternatives to this bid.

Phil Goulding: 4H's Despite how much fun it is to bid and make 25 HCP slams, in a serious IMP game, unless I felt we were behind and needed a big swing, I'd take the conservative route and bid 4H's. Partner may bid again with the magic hand, but most likely I'll miss a skinny but makeable slam and my partner will second guess me until his next mistake:) Ed. Note: Phil sent in an answer that included exploring trying for a slam. He felt it was risky and detailed his reasons. I couldn't print that because there simply wasn't enough room in the newsletter. I wish I had the room.).my partner will second guess me until his next mistake:)

Trudy Cohn:I will bid 4 hearts. Nothing that partner has said indicates anything but a minimum opening bid. He would have to have too many of the "right" cards for a slam to make.

Gail Carns: 4NT This bid is tough because I haven't been told if 2H was 4th suit game forcing (thus artificial) or not.

Steve Nolan: 3S. A below-game cue bid that's encouraging without going overboard. Over most continuations, my next bid will be 4H, after which partner can take command. If partner takes 3S as a Bluhmer (bidding the fourth suit after partner shows three suits = no wasted values in the fourth suit) we should still end up in the right spot.

.Jane Marshall: 3S. That is a cue asking for a return cue by my partner. When my partner raised hearts he showed 4-cd heart support. Now he has at most 1 spade. If he cuebids clubs, I will ask for keycards with heart agreed. If he does not show club control I will bid 4 hearts.

Bill Holt: 6H. Partner seems to be 1444 or 0454 so assuming we are not off 2 quick club tricks, I should have a play for 6. Let LHO lead his Ace of diamonds if he holds it.

Chris Wang .4H I take the low road and bid 4 hearts. I am void in partner's first bid suit, diamonds, and partner seems to be short in my first bid suit, spades. I am not sure if partner has 3 or 4 hearts. Plus the opening lead may be a heart to cut down on the cross ruff

Fred Schenker: 3S. This really depends on whether 2H is an artificial bid. Since you do not indicate an alert, I suppose we are to assume it is natural and forcing. Now I assume that any bid I make at this point (other than 4H) is a cue bid in support of H. Exclusion BW won't help with this auction because you really need to know about cards in the C suit. So I will bid 3S, hoping to hear 4C from partner. If I get 4D, I'm signing off. If I get 4C, I'm bidding 4D. Surely pard is either 0-4-(5-4) or 1-4-4-4. It seems like this problem should have sequels, because we're not done bidding, and I'm not bidding 6H without knowing about a C control

Asim Ulke 3S It appears that partner has a singleton or void in spades. I bid 3S. If partner cooperates with a 4C bid, I respond with a 4D bid. If partner's next bid is 4H, I sign off. These kind of hands may not produce 12 tricks unless a good hand with aces

Bob Zimmermann: 4 hearts. Perhaps there's slam here opposite a perfect fit. If I had exclusion blackwood for diamonds, I might even use that. But, my 2 heart bid should have been 4th suit forcing, so partner doesn't know I have hearts. Were I to bid any other suit, my 2H would be read as an artificial force. Add to that partner's likely 1354 shape with wasted diamond cards, and seem looks even less of a good bet. No. I'll take the low road here.

Stan Ruskin 3S You are now in a cue bidding sequence so I bid 3S showing the A and go from there. Partner has a singleton or void in S. So this could be good or not. Partners next bid will determine my bids. This is a hand that could make 4, 5,6 or 7. Even though 2H is 4th suit forcing, once I cue bid, I have agreed on H.

Paul Caplan: 3 spades. cue bid your ace. partners hand should be 1-4-4-4 or 0 -4-5-4. with good hearts and 2 aces you have a pathway to 6 hearts.
