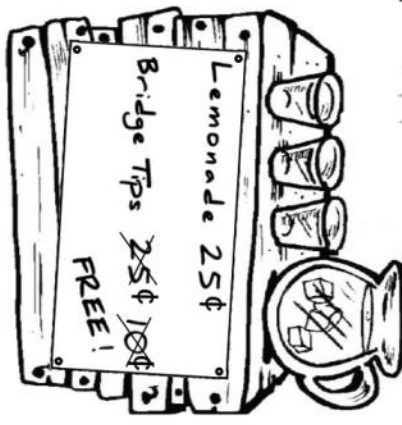

# BRIDGE BYTES

## THE SIMPLE SQUEEZE - PART II

Last month's article discussed the four necessary ingredients for a successful squeeze. A defender can be squeezed if they can only keep one card, and have to guard two suits. As long as declarer has a threat over that defender and an entry, the squeeze will be successful. The following hand exemplifies these components. South received a spade lead against their 6 NT contract. There are 11 top tricks and a chance for an extra trick if diamonds break 3-3. There is also the chance that hearts could break 3-3 and provide a 12th trick. To try for that possibility, declarer ducks a heart after winning the opening lead. The opponents win and return another spade.

Declarer is in position to run all of the remaining tricks except for one. By ducking the heart, they have rectified the count for a possible squeeze. Rectify the count just means losing a trick or tricks, so that there is only one loser. To avoid any ambiguity, declarer can now test one of the red suits. If they cash 3 top diamonds, they will find that West has a high diamond left. Before testing the hearts, South cashes the club winners. When the last club is led, West is squeezed. Notice that the squeeze would fail, if the defender's hands were exchanged. Dummy would have to discard before the defender.

The only expertise required in the hand is to duck a trick,( rectifying the count) and then run winners. As long as a defender has to guard two suits, and there is a threat sitting over them, they're squeezed as long as you have an entry in a threat suit.

**Jack Hawthorne: 2S.** Partner's 1S o/c was preempted by West's initial response. We have half the deck and 7-8 spades. Besides, I'm not going to the 3-level in my 3-card club suit. 2NT is my 2nd choice, and I might run there if one of the opponents looks like they're ready to devour 2S.

**Stan Ruskin : 3C** Sounds like partner has a 9-12 point hand with 4S (maybe 5) and 4 or 5C. East probably is 2/5/4/2 - maybe 2/5/5/1 or 1/5/4/3. W probably has 4 or 5S 2H, 2 or 3D and 3 or 4C. Thus, it appears to me that 3C is the best bid. It seems to me that it is more likely that partner has 5C than 5S. 3C should have a good chance of making since my Red kings are well placed.

**Arlene Port:** Because I write this column, I already knew the preferred responses, but nothing much about the distribution. However, if I had the hand that North held, I might consider passing and leading a trump. Clearly, declarer and partner have no fit. So, I would double only with a massive two suiter. I should get another point or so for giving an answer that was at the bottom of the list. I may not have brains, because I chose this answer, knowing it was not up there, but I have guts!

**Richard Katz 2S** I right side our two spade contract and hope partner is 5-1-3-4, or 5-2-2-4, or good spades 4-2-2-5 where qjx clubs will come in handy. Can't defend or think of n t with all cards in wrong positions. Feeling very uncomfortable. Although partner most probably has three hearts on this auction, maybe he has????

**Gail Carns 2S** This x shows a good hand with spades

**Herb Sachs: .. 3H** I am playing partner for a good hand with spades; how good? and how many spades? I have a very good hand and will be aggressive . I bid three hearts and raise three spades to four and wonder why partner did not bid spades.This is really a tough one.

**Asim Ulke: 2S** What would partner do holding spades and clubs over 1H pass 1S to him? He would pass. After the diamond bid on his left he can show his hand with a double. I expect a hand like 5-2-2-4 or 4-2-2-5 or similar in partners hand.

**Steve Nolan .2NT.** West is psyching. I think (s)he has very few (if any) points but some heart support, and intended to bid 2H all along. West's spades might be long or short because the sole purpose of the 1S bid was to make it harder for us to find our right spot. I bid 2NT which is right on points given the shape of my hand and tells partner about my stoppers in both of East's suits. If partner replies 3S, I'll raise to four.

**Bill Holt: 2S.** Partner has a black 2 suiter and likely has 3 Hearts on this auction (opps seem to be settling in 5-2 fit). He couldn't overcall 1S. We might have more cards in clubs, but I'd rather play at the 2 level. And in the Major in case it's matchpoints.

**Craig Biddle: 2NT** - partner has the black suits, I have red suit stoppers, E probably doesn't have a lot of entries. I expect partner to have something like AQxx xxx x A10xxx.

**Bob Zimmerman: 2 Spades.** To quote the immortal Al Roth, "What's the problem?". Partner has spades and no way to show them over the opponent's bid. Heck, Lefty might even have psyched a spade (does anybody do that anymore?) Given the sterile distribution, I'll go low.

**Chris Wang.** I am going to **pass**. Even though I have 10 points and a double fit, I have a 9 loser hand.

**Jane Marshall: Pass.** If my partner is crazy, they make it. I would lead a heart to keep declarer from ruffing diamonds. My partner could have bid spades if he really had lots of spades. I can't imagine this auction.

**Ernie Retetagos: 2 Spades.** Looks like partner has 3 hearts. I don't think that my vulnerable partner would come into their auction without some distribution. So I think that they probably have a singleton. I am expecting to find a good hand with 9 cards in the black suits.

**Phil Goulding:** I bid **2 S**, partner should be short in hearts and if he has 5 clubs he probably would have bid 3 clubs instead of double. If he has clubs and diamonds he would have bid 2NT, so he probably has 4+. spades and keeping it at the 2 level feels safer.

**Trudy Cohn: 2NT** Sounds like my partner must have spades and clubs. Can't have very many points given all the bidding. The only bid that my hand warrants is 2NT. Partner can take that back to three clubs if he wants to. I really don't understand why we are in the auction.

**Paul Caplan: 2NT** partner has the black suits and you have stoppers in the red suits and an average hand. 2nt shows those values. partner with a weak hand can pull to his best suit or bid a game with a better hand.
