Asim Ulke I bid 4S. If we have a better fit in Hearts or Clubs, so be it. I don't know a way to find it below the level of 5 or 6. I expect my partner to have a spade suit, good enough to play in game.

Bill Holt: 4S. Anything could be right. 3NT just buys a diamond lead thru partners Kx. 4H could be the wrong suit. 4d could get us overboard. Pass seems timid when I have 3 gold cards for partner. Makes you wish you opened an undisciplined 1H on this junk.

Herb Sachs 4D I bid 4D intending to pass 4S,4H,5C; if partner does not make one of these calls i will need more time!

Robert Zimmermann: 4S In the great tradition of Al Roth, I object! I'm not passing a 5/5 hand with 11 high (rule of 20) in first seat. Now what? Every action is flawed. I'm too big to pass (did I mention I would have opened ?)Yuck. **4 spades**, and hope for the best.

Gail Carns: 4S if I had 2 more spades I would bid 5S I think I should have one more H to bid 4H

Steve Nolan 4S. Since partner didn't double or bid 4D, I think he has a 15+ point single-suited hand. I can't pass with two aces and the queen in partner's suit; 4S is my guess at the right spot opposite the weakest hand partner can have. With a really good hand, partner can bid again.

Florine Walters. 4S It is close as to whether this hand calls for a cue bid of four clubs with only one spade, as I will have to follow up with another cue bid of four hearts if partner cues diamonds. If the bidding does go like that we will definitely be at the five level with perhaps no play. My first priority is to get a plus in match points so will forgo my optimism for a spade slam and bid four spades and hope we can make that.

Jane Marshall Pass. My partner is under pressure to bid and probably has a 6-card suit. He can bid expecting 2 tricks from me at this level. Since I do not have a fit with him, I won't dig the hole any deeper.

Eric Ruben: 4S. Partner could conceivably be stretching to get in the auction, but with two sticks, a fitting honor, and a source of tricks in either of his possible side suits, this must have play.

Bernie Fudor: I bid 3NT when i go down I will say I thought my A of H was the A of D. Sadly most of my partners will believe me. My second choice at MPs is pass. After all its only a board

Jim Bachelder 4S I don't know. There might be a better spot and we might be missing a slam but I'm not particularly enamored with this hand and I'm not looking for a better trump suit at the 4 level. .

Stan Ruskin PASS Since you didn't let me open 1H, I have a problem. After playing for three days in Phila., I can't imagine that anyone would pass this hand. I'm not saying that you shouldn't pass but that no one would. All of that being said, I can't think of anything else but to Pass 3S. I have no idea what, if anything, we can make so 3S seems as good as anything. Partner didn't double so he merely has some kind of overcall - probably an opening bid but we are in a competitive situation. Any other bid is a pure guess. If we all learned to pass a little more often, I think we would be much better bidders.

PJ Prabu . 4H. Choices are Pass (really?), 4C and 4H. I believe passing is too passive. 4C may preclude getting to 4H when pard has 3-card support. Hence I bid 4H in the hope of getting to the right contract. If pard rebids S, I can pass in comfort.

Paul Caplan: PASS partner only needs a long suit and a near opening values for his bid can lose 2 D and a long trump to start. exchange the spade and diamond holdings and i would try 4 spades. east can have a good hand with nowhere to go missing aces.

Marvin Rulin: 4Spades. Partner dd not double but came in at the three level knowing I had passed. He should have a good spade suit and I have very good values for a passed hand. We may be missing a 5-3 heart fit but I don't think my heart suit is good enough to bid at this level. Any other bid could be confusing to partner.

Arlene Port: 4H I didn't open this hand 1 or 2, so I clearly have a reasonable hand without 6 hearts. I expect my partner to either pass or correct to 4 spades if they don't have hearts. I would never make this bid with a void in spades and I have enough values for game somewhere.

Ernie Retetagos: 4 Hearts. I'll guess to bid 4 hearts. Partner should suspect a 5 card suit, since I didn't open 2 hearts. If I had values with a 6 card suit, I would have opened one or two hearts. I should abstain, since I would have opened this with one heart, and rebid clubs. By today's standards, this is a clear cut opening bid. Passing marginal hands at the one level just creates later problems against active opponents.

Ami Elis: 4D .South did not open this 7-loser hand, so he is delivering the best hand that North can dream of. North bid on her own so she has extra values. Game is likely, so the most descriptive bid by South is 4D, asking North to choose a game

Lou Joseph: I'm passing. Partner didn't double 3D which means his hand is either not suited for a take-out double pattern and/or strength-wise.
