NICE PARTNER - WHAT SHOULD I DO NOW?

A reader asked how to ask for Aces in this partnership auction, 1D-2C-3C-3NT. Should the Gerber or Blackwood convention be used in this sequence? Whenever a no trump bid is raised to 4 no trump, it is always natural and quantitative. 4 NT in this auction should be natural. Likewise, 1 NT-4NT is like a raise to 3 NT, but with more high cards. In the absence of any partnership agreements, the Gerber convention should only be used after a 1 or 2 no trump opening or rebids. By agreement, 4 clubs can also be Ace asking after a Stayman or transfer sequence. An example would be 1NT-2H-2S-4C. Any use of Gerber over anything other than directly over NT, should be discussed by regular partnerships.

There is an Ace asking convention called Kickback. When Kickback is only used over minor suits, it is called Redwood. Whatever the agreed upon suit is, a bid at the 4 level in the next highest suit is asking for Aces. If clubs is the agreed upon suit, 4 diamonds would ask for Aces. There is information available online for partnerships that would be interested in using this convention.

There should be a way to invite slam, but still play in no trump if partner is not interested. In the auction 1D-2C-3C-3NT, I play that 4 C is a natural slam try. Partner should cue bid their cheapest Ace, and you will cue your cheapest Ace. Instead of asking for Aces, cue bid Aces. When either partner subsequently bids 4 NT, that would be natural, and can be passed. This way you are not committed to the choice between 3 NT and 6 clubs. Usually if you have enough for 3 NT and have extras, you can take 10 tricks. If you happen to go down one in 4 NT, just be ready with a good explanation.

Trudy Cohn . 5S I will bid 5 spades which asks partner to bid 6 with second round Club control. Trudy Cohn

Jack Hawthorne:3D I think 3D should be the 1st step. 2nd round control is acceptable as a cuebid. It emphasizes the club weakness while keeping the bidding below game in spades

Paul Caplan: 4NT I am bidding slam if I am not off 2 aces. If partner has both aces I will ask for kings. If partner has the club king I will bid 7 based on the state of the match and I will play in spades.

- Game force

Richard Katz 3C I bid three clubs, allowing partner to bid n t from her side. Figuring 13 opposite twenty, I bid six n t gambling it has some play. O k at match points, could ruin entire imp day.

Asim Ulke . I bid **3D**. King of diamonds has to be an important card for partner to decide what contract to play. If partner bids blackwood than I can show the diamond king along with my aces. I intent to correct 7D to 7NT.

Chris Wang: 3H As I have 20 hcp and 5 losers, opposite an opening hand, I am interested in slam. As I am lacking in club controls, I will bid my controls, First I bid 3H to show I have first round control of hearts, and don't have first round control of both clubs and diamonds. Hopefully partner will either bid 3 spades or 4 clubs. Then I will bid 4 diamonds to show I have second round control of diamonds. If partner then stops in 4 spades, I will bid 5 hearts to show partner I have second round control of hearts and leave the decision regarding slam to partner. I will not use Blackwood as I have an open suit, clubs. This approach may be too conservative and we may miss a grand slam.

Steve Nolan .. 3D. Showing a king or ace in diamonds and bypassing clubs to show I have nothing there. Eventually, if partner doesn't bid Blackwood, I will. A small slam is all but guaranteed and it won't take all that much extra from partner for a grand.

Bill Holt: 3H. Spades are set as trumps, so I'll Q-bid my cheapest control, hoping to hear 4c from partner.

Bob Zimmermann 3 D. I'm looking for slam, but of course clubs are problematic. At this point, I'm going to show the diamond King - which has to be an important card. Over partner's inevitable 3NT, I will be 4NT (quantitative) and abide by his decision. At that point, I will have shown my values.

Ernie Retetagos: 3 Diamonds. I bid 3 diamonds so that I can show my partner the King. Partner is marked with the Ace or King of clubs, so the only question is whether or not we can bid a grand slam. If I subsequently bid 4 NT followed by 5 NT, showing all the Key cards in spades, partner may be able to bid 7 with long strong diamonds and the A K of clubs. With that hand partner should bid 7 NT, which could make even if spades break badly.

Herb Sachs: 3D Three diamonds; partner hopefully will bid four clubs; if I hear three spades I bid four spades; Could partner have

Jane Marshall 4NT (1430 keycard). Partner must have some good club cards to put on a game force. I am looking for slam in spades. The problem is in the spade suit (because partner does not have 4-card support (or he would have bid 2NT (Jacoby) with as his initial response). If we have all the Aces, I will bid 6 spades.

Stanley Ruskin: . 2NT. While there are, of course, a number of bids you can make, the only one that makes sense to me is 2NT which, in this case, is temporizing and doesn't waste bidding space. At this point, we have agreed that some number of Spades is the final contract so south is asking north to start cue bidding and also implying that his distribution is 5/4/1/3.

Gail Carns: 3S asking partner to Q-bid if they bid 3D I will bid 5S asking for 2nd round control of C

Bernie Fudor: 3S It seems that we should be in slam, Best way I is to bid 3 sp that requires a cue bid if my pd bids 4c I will bid 4h
